### **GUIDE TO ISRCs**

How to construct the ISRC: (Note: there should be <u>NO</u> spaces or hyphens in your ISRCs)

### What is the ISRC?

The ISRC (International Standard Recording Code) is the international identification system for sound recordings and music videos. Each ISRC is a unique and permanent identifier for a specific recording which can be permanently encoded into a product as its digital fingerprint.

The International Federation of the Phonographic Industry (IFPI) recommends that all music producers use ISRC.

### **Benefits of using ISRC**

- ISRC is a unique, reliable, international identification system.
- ISRC provides a unique tool for the purpose of rights administration.
- ISRC is a useful identification tool in the electronic distribution of music.
- ISRC coding is compatible with standards developed in the field of consumer electronics and is readable by hardware already used in the recording industry.
- ISRC is cost effective it can be put into operation without requiring special investment in equipment or technologies.

## How to register your Tracks with ISRCs.

ISRCs are mandatory when registering tracks for both ISRC and Distribution/Membership purposes.

After applying the ISRCs like the example below; complete and return the <u>Excel</u> PPI Track Registration Form (see attachments). <u>Please only register tracks previously unregistered</u>.

### Note 1: Ensure that you change 'XXX' to your relevant ISRC – this is an example only. Note 2: Ensure that there is <u>NO</u> hyphens or spaces in your ISRCs.

- Track 1IEXXX1600001Track 2IEXXX1600002
- Track 3 IEXXX1600003 etc.

Note: Year Of Reference is the year that you are *applying* the codes to the recording. At the beginning of a year, *change* the Year to the current year and *reset* the Track Designation code to 00001.
